#### **Grand Knights Report**

With the 4th of July coming up and all of the history we enjoy around Baltimore, Washington DC and Philadelphia, I thought it would be interesting to tell you about a baby boy born in 1900. His name was Pier Giorgio Frassati in Turin Italy into a wealthy family, who owned a newspaper called La Stampa. Though an average student, Frassati was known among his peers for his devotion and piety. He was dedicated to works of social action, charity, prayer and community. He was involved with Catholic youth and student groups, the Apostleship of Prayer, Catholic Action, and was a third order Dominican. He would often say, "Charity is not enough; we need social reform." He helped establish a newspaper entitled *Momento*, whose principles were based on Pope Leo XIII's encyclical: Rerum Novarum.

Despite his family's enormous wealth and power, Frassati's father was austere and never gave his children too much spending money. Frassati, however, donated most or all of his money to people he saw as more "needy" than him, and as a result he became accustomed to giving his train-fare to the poor and running back home or riding in third class. Despite the many organizations to which Frassati belonged, he was not a passive "joiner"; records show that he was active and involved in each, fulfilling all the duties of membership. He was strongly anti-fascist and did nothing to hide his political views.

Frassati died in 1925 of poliomyelitis. His family expected Turin's elite and political figures to come to offer their condolences and attend the funeral; they naturally expected to find many of his friends there as well. They were surprised, however, to find the streets of the city lined with thousands of mourners as the cortege passed by. Poor people from the city petitioned the Archbishop of Turin to begin the cause for canonization. The process was opened in 1932 and Frassati was called Man of Eight Beatitudes by Pope John Paul II, who beatified him on May 20, 1990. Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati's feast day is the 4th of July. Frassati is the Patron Saint of Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School in Oklahoma City, OK where Frassati's family blessed the school in his spirit.

#### Still have just group insurance?

As a Knights of Columbus field agent, I hear about group life insurance every week. If you have it, it's certainly not a bad thing, but it can be a misleading security blanket. Most times, the amount offered is far from what you need, and the only way to determine what you really need is with a comprehensive needs analysis. Your group coverage is not based on any analysis. Instead, they apply a formula: you make "X" amount in salary and the group life is either a flat amount or a multiple of your salary. These receipts were donated by the Council, as a Pro Life project to the Chimbota Mission in Peru, which is a free hospital for expectant mothers. 2,000 Rosary pamphlets were distributed by the team. Reverend Fathers, Family and Friends of Fr. Joseph Simmons,

Twenty-five years ago, as Grand Knight of Notre Dame Council, I had the honor of presenting Fr. Simmons with a check that would take him to the Supreme Convention that year. A quarter of a century later, I have again been asked to say a few words about Fr. Simmons and his association with the Knights of Columbus. Suffice to say that there could be several hundred other brother knights that would jump at the chance to be in this position, but I gratefully was the one asked to speak.

Fr. Simmons joined Notre Dame Council on October 28, 1964 at the request of one of his parishioners at St. Matthews Parrish, Tom Blair. Fr. Simmons went on to be our Council Chaplain a short time later. He has been our Council Chaplain or Associate Chaplain since then. He has also served as State Chaplain for two different State Deputies and as Faithful Friar of Charles Carroll of Carrollton Assembly. His combined chaplaincy to the Knights of Columbus alone is twice as many years as he has been a priest.

They are the hard cold facts of Fr. Simmons and the Knights of Columbus. What those simple facts do not show are the man that God called to the priesthood those many years ago. He has spent countless hours as chaplain advising Grand Knights on the spiritual needs of the Council.

When I first joined Notre Dame Council, Fr. Simmons was the chaplain at the University Hospital. Upon being reassigned, I remember thinking that his talents were not being used to their fullest. You see, during his tenure at the Hospital, my family was trying to cope with several deaths and serious illnesses. I, naively at the time, thought that he had done something special for me and my family. I was so wrong. Over the last thirty-four years, I have seen and heard stories of how Fr. Simmons has done the same for countless brother knights. Fr. Simmons has a way of making everything he does special for all, not just my family.

It was not all spiritual though. I remember a story that a Past Grand Knight left the Council one night after a party and forgot to bring his wife home. This was before cell phones. As he remembered he left his wife at the Council, here she comes in the house, thanks to the Fr. Simmons' taxi service.

Most recently with me, Fr. Simmons provided spiritual guidance on the loss of our Great-Granddaughter. For us, and countless other Knights and their families, Fr. Simmons always has the right words and the ability to make us know that the Lord is with us and he can give comfort with his soft spoken words.

When he came to Holy Spirit Church as pastor, the Knights of Columbus paid back some of the kindness and devotion to him by having a fund raiser for the building fund to get the present church off the ground. I forget how much we made for the fund, but there were knights and their wives falling over each other to help him and his parish. The Knights, in recognition of his service to the Council, Assembly, and State, have also bought and installed the flagpole on the lawn of Holy Spirit. Several weeks ago, at the State Convention of the Knights of Columbus I took Fr. Simmons to lunch. He offered to pay but the last time he bought me lunch, I was the main laborer for the installation of the flag pole. I can't put in another pole ..... so I paid.

Personally, for the last thirty-four years, I have been blessed to have Fr. Simmons as a spiritual advisor and friend, and the Knights of Columbus have been blessed with his guidance for 47 of his 50 years. I know we all hope to be blessed by him for many more years to come.
